### **Pushy Parents Raise More Successful Kids**

Children of pushy parents are more likely to excel in high school, graduate from college and grow into young adults who are happier with their lives and more prosperous in their careers.

The findings of the latest survey of Michigan's culture of education blow to bits the philosophy of laissezfaire child-rearing that's the hallmark of Baby Boomer parents.

The prevailing attitude is that children should be nudged, not pushed; nurtured, not nagged; encouraged to find their own way in an environment of low pressure and low expectations. Doing this does not produce nearly the results as a firm hand on the shoulder and the parental command of "Go this way."

Few children are getting that sort of direction from their parents, according to the Your Child survey of Michigan residents aged 18-30, conducted by EPIC-MRA. Only 30% of the young adults say their parents insisted on them going to college. Those children didn't rebel, as the popular parenting wisdom suggests. Instead, they were more likely to earn a

degree and to land in jobs that make them happier and pay them more than those with hands-off parents.

Parents who didn't mention college much, or didn't care if their children got post-high school training, have only a 1-11 chance of seeing their children graduate from college.

This new survey dovetails perfectly with an earlier poll of Michigan parents that found only 28% considered education essential to their children's success and further explains why only 23% of state (MI) adults hold college degrees.

Everything we know about the future of work tells us that those with an education will weather the global economic storm, while those without one will be washed away. The young people understand this: Nearly twice as many say education is essential as do their parents, even if they [parents] didn't go to college themselves. This is a hopeful sign that they'll be more insistent [on post-secondary education] when raising the next generation.


